

# Let's Explore with HOMER at Home: All About ME!

### Learning Connections

Play “Simon Says” and have your child focus on specific parts of their body: shut your eyes, wiggle your nose, touch elbows to knees. The sillier the actions the better! You can also make a giant letter M on a big sheet of paper. Tell your child to hop on the M, hop off the M, tap the M with their elbows. Be as silly as you want!
